### ***Driving Miss Daisy***

This play, with just three actors and a simplistic stage, was very well received. Sixty retirees and their guests attended this performance at the Masonic Heritage Center October 21. This fairly new theater was beautifully appointed, very accessible with a large parking lot.

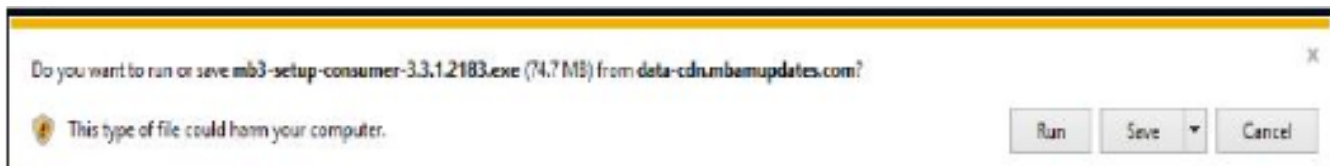

## Techie Questions from Members

I have been getting asked about machines that seem to be running slower and about so many programs that show as running. The real question is always do have malware or virus issues on my computer. The answer is always maybe. Along with that answer I always recommend to people to run a program called MalwareBytes. I know I have talked about this before but as we all know sometimes it doesn't hurt to repeat. This is one of the highest rated programs for the removal of malware. There is a free version as well as versions that you can purchase. I have always used the free version and had great success with it.

Now that I have you sold on running it I am going to give information on obtaining it. Here is the link that you can go to get it <https://www.malwarebytes.com/mwb-download/>. As you can see there are different versions. Click on the Download Free button. When you do you will get installation instructions and the download should have started. You will most likely get a message at the bottom of your screen like this:



I usually do a save as and save it where I could go and run the install again if I needed to but you could also just select Run. Just follow the instructions for the installation.

Once it is installed you should run it like once every 2-4 weeks. When you run it and it finds issues I always tell it to clean them all up. Some of the items are minor but if you just clean up everything you don't have to figure out what each item is. Good Luck with getting your computer cleaned of any malware.
